
An important note about absences

Keeping accurate attendance records is an important part of the running of our school and a key factor to your child(ren)'s safety. It is therefore, essential that parents and caregivers remember to report their child(ren)'s absence via the school app, email or phone. Any unexplained absences will eventually be treated as truant and duly noted.

Room 25's Cross Country Conundrum

During our cross country training, we had a hard time remembering how many laps we had run. To help us solve this problem we thought about the resources and constraints we had and developed a solution – code a Micro:bit to count our laps and provide motivation as we run.

We used the <u>www.makecode.org</u> website to code our Microbits. By pushing 'Button A' the Micro:bit counted each lap and 'Button B' saw an inspirational message appear across the screen. We tested our creations out by wearing them during our cross country training!



Micro: Bits

A Micro:Bit is a miniature device with several options to use as inputs including A, B, A+B, Shake and many others. You can use two methods to code these fascinating little machines, Block code or JavaScript for more advanced coders. The device is roughly half the size of an average credit card.

When you open for the first time you will most likely see the power bank first. To power it on, you must slide the 'Off' to 'On'. As mentioned previously, there is an A button, a B button, and a Reset button on the back. On the front there are twenty-five led lights which can be used to show pictures, words and numbers. The power bank is connected to the body of the device via a single dual-pin connector, and to transfer the code, you first have to go to this <u>Website</u>, download your code, then plug in the Micro-USB into your computer, then drag the downloaded code into the Micro:Bit folder.

The board has all the things that a normal computer has be it maybe on a smaller scale, a processor, a built-in compass, an accelerometer which measures proper <u>acceleration</u>, two-hundred-fifty-six kilobytes of accelerated flash memory and sixteen kilobytes of Ram. By George
