

I thought, how on earth does it go so fast in the water with such a huge weight? I don't think it could float with such an enormous mass and if he's heavier than water he will stay on the bottom of the river, fully submerged for quite some time. *Zander.* 

Underwater hippo's travel along 'hippo paths' on the bottom of rivers and lakes. The reason they don't float back to the surface is that gravity keeps them grounded as well as the weight of their heavy bones. *Isabella* 

Hippo's have thick rubbery skin and lots of whiskers. Caleb

Hippos' are murky coloured mammals with short stout legs and hairy noses. They weigh about 3 to 4 tonnes and can move very fast underwater compared to a speed boat. They use their strong muscles to push off or leverage their weight so they can almost gallop through the water.
