


In Year 1 we launched our inquiry into 'Nature's Curiosities' with a fantastic morning of hands on provocations, invitations and experiences. It was a truly magnificent way to set the students curiosities in motion. Everything from a bearded dragon, dinosaur fossil dig, interesting plants to explore, Chester the dog visiting, Blue the bird for observational drawings, shells and sand, and curiosities in jars... it was engaging for one and all.



The whole school has been learning about Thinking Maps as a way to organise and extend our thinking. The Year 1 students are no exception and in Room 8 we have introduced the Circle Map and the Bubble Map. These help us to prepare for our writing by brainstorming descriptive vocabulary and to investigate our understandings in relation to the inquiry, as we create and clarify our own definitions.



This inquiry also provides several opportunities to extend our artistic skills. We hope you enjoy these examples of the art going on in Room 8 this term.



We are excited to see where our inquiry takes us next and also preparing ourselves as we head towards the last weeks of the school year. It's a busy, fun and beautiful time of the year.
