## Accessing Tax Receipts

For those of you wanting to access your tax receipts, this can be done quickly through the parent eTAP portal at [www.atschool.co.nz](http://www.atschool.co.nz) and then entering your username and password. Then all you have to do is click on the “My Child” tab and then “Tax Receipts” at the bottom. This function is updated automatically when you make a payment, so there is no need to wait for a specific date or time. The receipt will auto-generate when payment is processed in eTAP by the school.
