Fundraising 2023

In 2022, our hard-working fundraising team raised a total of \$19,882. That funding is invested in your children. \$10,000 goes to maintaining our playgrounds and break time equipment. The remaining \$9,882 helps contribute to the cost of our student support programmes, specifically reading recovery for our junior students. A special mention of thanks goes to our wonderful fundraising team, including parent reps, who have been instrumental throughout the year in engaging our community and leading fundraising initiatives that go towards enhancing opportunities for our children.

Prepare for success

Set yourself and your child up for a successful start to the year. As we build up for the start of the 2023 academic year, I'd suggest the following three things:

Talk with your child about their learning goals for 2023

What are your goals for 2023? What are the goals your whānau have for your children for 2023? Start the year with a purpose and set goals that you want to achieve. These might be academic goals, like improving your basic facts or better planning your writing. You might have work habits goals, like checking with the teacher when you're unsure of what's expected or making sure you are working with other students to stay focused. You may have social goals around working with others or building positive relationships with new friends and classmates. Whatever your goals are, talk together as a family about what you hope to achieve and what success will look like.

Have your stationery ready for day 1
