As we explore our big inquiry context of 'communication', our students have been looking at a range of methods of communication. Be it brail, morse code, or the various other methods our children are exploring, we're finding how communication can be used in different situations to share information. Our junior students in year one have been looking at how we communicate with symbols. We're committed to keeping our school a safe and positive environment for our students. I thought I'd take this opportunity to remind our community about the symbols around our school. While we don't want to be a school with signs everywhere telling people what they can't do, there are some things we need people to know so everyone is safe to enjoy our grounds.

When you enter the grounds, you'll see these symbols. They let you know our rules everywhere in our school.



- Dogs are welcome but need to always be on a lead on our grounds. Anything they drop needs to be picked up and put in a bin
- Rubbish isn't to be dropped on the grounds
- Our grounds are smoke-free at all times
- Our grounds are alcohol-free unless the school expressly states otherwise
- There are always CCTV cameras operating at our school, all over the grounds

Our two turfs have some extra safety concerns

- Dogs aren't allowed on the turf
- Our turf isn't suitable for Golf, Cricket, rugby boots, or bikes
- Don't eat food on our turf
- Children need to be supervised by adults on the turf
- Our turfs are covered by CCTV cameras
