Kia ora e te whānau,

Thank you to everyone who attended our meet the teacher picnic! The greatest resource we have as a school is our people. The meet the teacher picnic is an important start to our year as we come together for our shared aim of making this and every year the best it can be for every member of our community. The relationship between parents and classroom teachers is an important one. I encourage our community to keep in close contact with their teachers through the year to ensure we make the most of every learning opportunity.

The Library is open!

Many of you got to meet our new Librarian, Kath Twomey, at our meet the teacher picnic. Kath has been busy working to ensure our library is ready for every student to enjoy our fabulous collection. On Monday the 19th of February, our library re-opened. It is open Monday through Thursday for classes to visit, and at lunch time. All classes have a weekly visit to browse and issue books, and 4 days a week the library is open at lunchtime for browsing, quiet games and for those students looking for a break from the hustle and bustle of the playground. Talk with your children about when their library time is and look out for some new issues coming home in bags.

Friday Fizz is back!

Friday Fizz returns for 2024, and children will be given their options on Monday the 19th to choose their Friday Fizz for term one and 2. Friday Fizz is predominantly about children trying something new and getting to enjoy the breadth of the curriculum. Talk with your children about what they'd like to try or what new opportunity they would like to take up. Skiing will return for Friday Fizz for 2024. For 2024 we are trialing longer 90 minute lessons for our students. We have been amazed at the progress our students make with the Snowplanet instructors but have found, it's a long way to go for just 60 minutes on the snow. This Ski series is ten 90-minute lessons. If you'd like to sign your child up for Skiing, use this link or follow the QR code to sign up. Skiing costs \$680 and is limited to 50 children. It will be first in first served for the 50 spots.

Sailing and kayaking is back for 2024, and our children will get to make the most of our long relationship with waterwise at Okahu Bay. For children to take part in this

opportunity, we do need parent volunteers to keep our children safe. If your child wants to sign up for this, you will need to attend as a volunteer.

Crochet has an additional cost of \$15 for materials. If your child signs up for this, you will receive an invoice for materials.

Non-Uniform Day Wednesday 21 February

For those families new to PDS, Non-Uniform Day is a day where students can wear their own clothes from home instead of their school uniform. Please bring a \$1 or \$2 coin as a donation for our Whānau & Friends'

School Donations 2024

Parnell District School relies on donations from our community to provide a rich and engaging programme for all learners. This year, your donation will fund additional teachers to ensure our lower teacher-student ratio in all classes and supplements our resourcing to ensure all classrooms have the resources they need for learning. Your donation also supports the Friday Fizz and OE programmes, ensuring our students get opportunities for exploration and extension across the curriculum.

For 2024, the donation request remains at \$480 per child, which equates to \$120 per term. We understand the start of the year can be a tough time for families, so remember we are happy for you to make part payments throughout the year or contribute your donation later in the year. Mobile Phones at School

You will be aware that children at Parnell District School are not to use mobile phones during the day. As we notice more children bringing phones to use before and after school, we want to help you keep them safe. We know leaving phones in our bags during the day is a risky thing to do, so we want to make sure your phone is safe and meets our new Government direction about mobile phones in school. If you have a mobile phone, your teacher will collect it in the morning and send it to the office for safe storage. Mobile phones will be locked away during the day and returned at home time. Any students using their mobile phone during the day (including break times), the phone will be safely stored at the office until collected by a parent or caregiver.


