Kia ora e te whānau,

What a wonderful term we've had. I want to congratulate our staff and students on an amazing start to 2024. From our first student inquiry around creating our learning culture to our current study of Science in 'it matters' studying states of matter and how things change, our students have been hard at work in classrooms developing their skills. We have just two weeks left of our inquiry when we return next term, so undoubtedly, there will be many scientific questions over the break.

Next term, we have Performing Arts Week coming up in Week 3. The focus of Performing Arts Week this year is dance and movement. Everyone will be exploring the language of dance and how we communicate through dance. The focus week will culminate with our dance performances for Year 0-3 on May 17th and Year 4-8 on Thursday May 23rd at the Cathedral. We are excited to give every student the opportunity to develop their understanding of dance and for our older students to perform in this iconic venue. Following our Performing Arts Week, we will begin our next inquiry, Economy - Te Ōranga. This is a social sciences inquiry where we will take an Aotearoa New Zealand Histories lens on economies, trading and sharing of resources.




